

Local development plans

- Used to decide planning applications for development and change of use
- Strategy
 - Whole Council area
 - More detail on small number of areas of development
- Policies
 - 89, grouped in 8 sections
- Proposals
 - On a detailed map
- Material considerations can justify a departure from plan

Process

- Must conform to SDP 2
- Must have regard to various other documents
- Statutory process
- Examination makes binding recommendations
- Evaluation of LDP 1 project has informed new plan project



Citizens: elect Council

Full Council:

- Sets Council Aims & Business Plan
- Adopts Development Plan
- Sets budget (link to Action Programme)

Housing & Economy Cttee:

- Approves main docs: Main Issues Report; Proposed Plan, Plan as Modified (after examination); Action Programme
- Approves participation strategy (in Development Plan Scheme)
- Refers Plan to Full Council for adoption

Planning Cttee:

Uses Plan to determine applications

Ward Cllrs: represent

their wards

T&E Cttee:

 Approves related strategies

F&R Cttee:

 Consider financial implications of AP

Project Board

Courts: consider legal challenge to adopted Plan

Scottish Ministers:

- Appoint exam reporter
- Can instruct changes to Plan / prevent adoption
- Approve SDP 2



Stage 1:

Pre-MIR Engagement

Engagement Sessions 1:

- CCs & Cllrs: NE,NW,SE,SW
- Topic groups e.g. housing, employment, with devs, CCs & Cllrs

Output: ideas for choices to present in MIR, for project team to develop

Engagement Sessions 2:

- Previous engagement groups + Children & Young Peoples Engagement Programme
- Road test draft questions & choices to codesign MIR
- Coordinate on how to consult wider citizenry

Output: 'buy in' from formal stakeholders on content and form of MIR consultation









Transport strategy framework



- Sets out transport policies/actions
- Multiple indicators/specific targets



Key Issues

- City/Regional growth
- Congestion
- Road safety
- Air quality
- Vehicle dominated streets/lack of public space
- Walking and cycling
- Public transport accessibility
- Freight



Low Emission Zones (LEZ)

- CEC and Scottish Government have committed to implementing LEZs in Scotland's 4 main cities by 2020
- LEZs will help to improve air quality in Edinburgh
- A number of places in Edinburgh fail pollution limits
 - declared Air Quality Management Areas
 - Nitrogen dioxide from road traffic emissions
- Air pollution impacts human health –
 particularly vulnerable people (young, elderly, and
 those with respiratory and cardiovascular
 conditions)

Central Edinburgh Transformation



- Re-imagine the city centre 2050 Vision
- Co-ordinate projects e.g. George St, Picardy Place,
 City Centre West-East Link, Meadows to George St
- Transform experience of streets and public spaces
- Prioritise walking, cycling and public transport




