The Strategy recognizes that we need to do more to share knowledge and skills, and innovate to tackle the challenges we face.

The strategy highlights and commits to the following pilots and innovative projects:

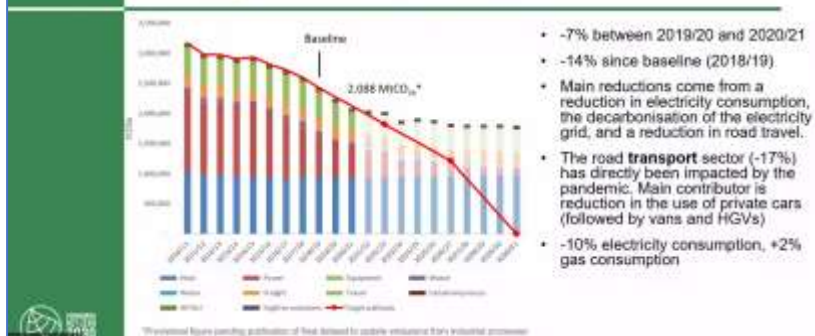
- New net zero development at **Granton Waterfront**
- New **200 hectare coastal park** in North West Edinburgh
- **'Edinburgh Homes Demonstrator'**, using off-site construction techniques to deliver net zero, energy efficient buildings
- Testing approaches to **retrofit** in challenging mixed-tenure and heritage settings, including Edinburgh's World Heritage site
- **Pilot public service EV charging hubs** in locations which align with the City Mobility Plan's aims of increasing sustainable travel and avoid adding to city-centre congestion

Progress to Date

- Established new climate board and supporting working groups – **Infrastructure Investment Programme Board (IIPB)**.
- Adaptation Plan due for consultation.
- Agreement for additional resource.
- Supported creation of Edinburgh Climate Commission with EVOC.
- Funded Edinburgh Community Climate Fund.
- Co-created Edinburgh Climate Forum and supported production of Climate Compact.
- Endorsed Plant Based Treaty.
- Continued reduction of emissions across council estate
