Some key questions

- 1. What are current local business challenges primarily as perceived by business owners and, based on that, what do businesses need/want?
- 2. What would Community Councils and/or EACC want from an increased focus on businesses and what could individual CCs, Community Councillors, and/or EACC offer to help achieve that?
- 3. How do local businesses understand CC remit/work and therefore how do they see a stronger business-CC link working for them and the local community?
- 4. What are the possible next steps for EACC and Community Councils across the city?



The Corstorphine Business Community: Origins and current status

- An initiative of Corstorphine Community Council
- Project assigned to ACB who became
 Corstorphine CC Business & Licensing Lead
- Key milestones
 - Scoping from late 2019 and subsequent set up of Steering Group
 - Making business contacts, initial meetings, pandemic business community support and associated networking
 - Constitution signed off January 2021 and officebearers elected
 - Western Edinburgh Neighbourhood Network grant award February 2021

Current status

- 22 members (6 applications from networking event on 24th May)
- Regular in-person meetings, emerging cycle of annual events and start of larger, broader meetings

Challenges

- Moving from interest to participation and maintaining a reasonable level of that
- Multi-member participation vs core group 'service' activity; expectations
- Consideration and articulation of purpose and value – continual/evolving





- Encourages consumers to 'shop local' and support small businesses in their communities, including via online & using social media reviews


On the first Saturday in December each year:
